About the Workshop

This workshop is designed to help Unitarian Universalist congregations dismantle racism by allowing participants to examine both personal and institutional racism, and by empowering them to develop a realistic plan that can move their congregations forward in working for racial justice. Objectives of the workshop are to:

- Increase awareness of racism within the church and the larger community;
- Recognize the power/privilege of racism from personal and institutional perspectives;
- Identify activities and responses that promote the elimination of racism;
- Identify the challenges and barriers to working toward eliminating racism;
- Examine our denominational values, principles, and purposes in relation to the vision of a Jubilee World;
- Begin the process of building an anti-racism transformation team.

Registration

The cost of the workshop is \$30 for non-students over 18 and \$10 for students and youth. Registration includes all food (heavy snacks Friday evening, breakfast and lunch on Saturday).
