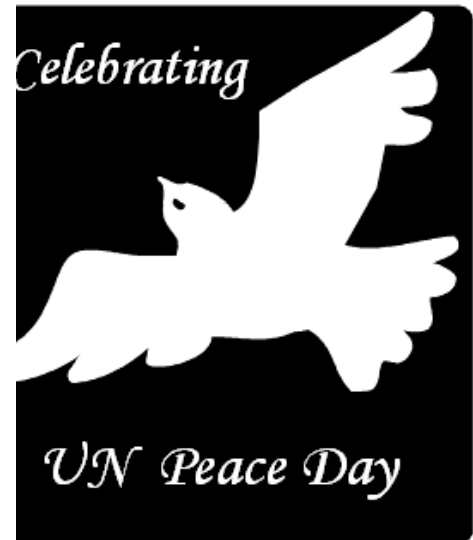

Dr. Sarsar is Professor of Political Science and Assoc. VP for Academic Program Initiatives at Monmouth University. He specializes in Middle East affairs. Mr. Anthony is an international consultant and New York City educator in the area of peace management, youth leadership and community building.

Our international speaker, W. Gyude Moore, was forced to leave his native Liberia and his family became refugees. His experiences led him to want to create a world where other children would not have such experiences. He is a Pedro Arrupe Scholar on peace at Georgetown University, and has been a keynote speaker at the UN and numerous universities.
