- What:** Fifteen hours of Our Whole Lives Training for Elementary School OWL Leaders
- Who:** This is for Leaders who want to facilitate OWL in grades K-1 and/or 4-6. DREs, RE Chairs and Ministers are also welcome. Registration is limited, so sign up early!!
- When:** November 7-9, 2008. Friday 7pm to Sunday 3pm. Full participation is required for certification as an OWL Leader. Avoid the Friday afternoon rush hour traffic and come early in the day. Dinner will be available at 5:30, so come early and relax before we start. **We must start on time!**

Leaders:

Lara Campbell is the Director of Religious Education at Community Unitarian Church at White Plains, NY. She is a fifth generation UU with an extensive UU leadership background, including having served as a RE program assistant, middle and high school youth advisor, chaplain for district and continental YRUU conferences, and participating in Young Adult programming. She is also a continental trainer of teachers for both the Our Whole Lives 7-9/10-12 and the K-1/4-6 programs and one of the developers of the YRUU Chaplain Training Program. Lara has an MA in Marriage and Family Therapy and a BA in Family Social Science. Her previous employment includes being a youth development specialist, a health educator, an elementary school counselor, and a substance abuse and reproductive health counselor.

Kevin Drewery is the Director of Lifespan Faith Development for the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Las Vegas, Nevada. He first encountered the *Our Whole Lives* curricula as a guest panelist for a session on Bi-Sexual/Gay/Lesbian/Transgender issues for an *Our Whole Lives* 7-9 class in Adelphi, Maryland in spring of 2000. Kevin is an *Our Whole Lives* 7-9 and 10-12 facilitator and a trainer for the K-1 and 4-6 curricula. He has previous experience as a sexuality educator. During the late eighties and early nineties, Kevin did Safer-Sex trainings for gay and lesbian hotline volunteers in Greensboro, North Carolina as well as an annual training for the Gay/Straight Alliance at Guilford College. *Our Whole Lives* is just one part of his ministry to children and youth. He is also a trained YRUU Chaplain and a Spirituality Development Conference trainer.
